- Serves as a role model for others
- Outstanding performance as a volunteer

- Demonstrates courage, leadership and innovation
- Has spent more than five years in community volunteerism

Member of the Year

This award recognizes an individual who has demonstrated courage, transparency in leadership, innovation and vision that has resulted in excellent service to the members of NABCJ.

Award Criteria-Member of the Year

- Has inspired others within the organization to serve
- Has support and respect of peers
- Brought recognition to NABCJ in a significant way
- Demonstrated professionalism and integrity
- Has demonstrated leadership that has translated into making a positive impact for the organization and community
- Volunteers time in the community
- Demonstrated dedication to the field of criminal justice
- Must be a member in good standing with NABCJ

President's Award

This award recognizes an individual who has unselfishly served others with integrity and respect, inspired others to excellence, exhibited professionalism and has made service to others a lifelong goal.

Award Criteria-President Award

- Extent and span of work in career
- The number of people who have been impacted by their work
- Legacy the individual will leave as a result of their contribution to the community
- References that can attest to the work of the individual
